

The Cyril Ramaphosa Education Trust (CRET) Bursary Programme was formed by the Cyril Ramaphosa Foundation, with the aim of providing financial assistance to students from financially disadvantaged backgrounds, who demonstrate strong academic results and would otherwise not be able to afford to study further.

CRET bursaries are awarded for studies in ANY field (entry level/ first time study module/ undergraduate).

The CRET bursary aims to provide funding to students who may otherwise be overlooked by other bursary programmes – the programme considers the holistic needs of candidates, their potential, and student who with enough support, nurturing and mentoring, will become leaders of the future.

The Dell Young Leaders programme helps students navigate through common barriers to graduation, offering support in the areas most needed to ensure they move on to a meaningful career. Students complete ample leadership and career training, overcoming their individual challenges to graduate from university and are matched with employer partners in their field of study where, as programme Alumni, they become leaders in their chosen professions.

Each year, qualifying first year financial aid students from the University of Cape Town, the University of Pretoria, and Stellenbosch University are invited to apply to the Dell Young Leaders programme.

Invites are sent during the second term from the university's financial aid office and directly from the programme via email.

Applications from students at other universities, or outside of those individuals invited to apply, are not accepted.


Ikusasa Student Financial Aid Programme

The Ikusasa Student Financial Aid Programme (ISFAP) caters for the higher education needs and costs of South Africa's poor and middle-class students. The programme aims to fast track South Africa's skills production for the 21st century by funding the higher education costs of mainly students studying towards a career in Occupations of High Demand (OHDs), which have been identified as critical to South Africa's economic development by the Human Resources Development Council (HRDC). These include Actuaries, Accountants, Engineers, Medical Doctors, Pharmacists and Prosthetists at 11 partner universities around the country.

ISFAP provides qualifying students with the full cost of studies including all tuition costs as well as accommodation and travel (if the student does not have accommodation), books, meals and a stipend (living allowance). In addition, ISFAP's partner universities provide students with academic support, social support, life skills training and medical support when required.

The JB Marks Education Trust Fund gives financial support to those who otherwise could not afford a proper education leading to professional qualification and fulfilling careers, chiefly in the mining and related sectors.

The fund, which caters predominantly for National Union of Mineworkers (NUM), dependants, immediate family, retrenched members and retirees, pays for registration, tuition, exams, textbooks, extra lessons by tutors, meals, accommodation, capacity-building programmes. It also pays for full-time and part-time correspondence courses and aims to help as many bursars as possible, depending on fund availability.

Usually, about 250 students a year receive support (200 undergraduates and 50 postgraduates).

Make A Difference (MAD) Leadership Foundation supports students from Grade 8 throughout their tertiary degree. Founded by Chairman, Francois Pienaar, MAD provides financial assistance as well as supporting the individual in their personal and professional development for the future achieved through a multi-disciplinary team, skilled in various professions to ensure that any barrier the scholar is facing is removed in the most effective and efficient manner.

MAD offers a comprehensive scholarship programme that focuses on individual support and development.

The Moshal Program is a private, philanthropic program that supports students from challenging socio-economic backgrounds. The program currently supports around 1 000 students in South Africa and Israel and takes pride in its 1 000 graduates who've very successfully graduated with university degrees.

The programme supports students studying Commerce / Accounting, Actuarial Science, Computer Science / Information Technology, Data Science / Mathematics / Statistics, Engineering and Medicine / Pharmacy degrees at WITS, UP, UCT, Stellenbosch, UKZN, UFS, Rhodes, NMU and UJ.

National Student Financial Aid Scheme

National Student Financial Aid Scheme (NSFAS) is a government entity under the Department of Higher Education and Training (DHET) to provide financial support to disadvantaged students who wish to further their studies at public universities or TVET colleges across a variety of academic courses.

NSFAS covers accommodation, living allowance, transport and learning materials as aligned with the relevant and latest approved DHET guidelines for these expenses. To qualify for NSFAS, you must be a South African citizen whose combined gross household income is not more than R350 000 per annum.

THE NSFAS ONLINE APPLICATION PORTAL TYPICALLY OPENS AT THE END OF SEPTEMBER AND CLOSES AT THE END OF JANUARY EVERY YEAR.
